AFFIDAVIT OF MR STEPHEN CLOCHERTY

At GLASGOW on the TWENTY FIFTH day of JANUARY Two
Thousand and Twelve, in the presence of LYNN FRASER Solicitor and Notary
Public, COMPEARED MR STEPHEN CLOCHERTY residing at [REDACTED]
[REDACTED] who being solemnly sworn depones as follows:-

1. My date of birth is [REDACTED].
2. I was at primary school with Victor Tamburrini and we were best friends from about the age of seven.
3. I recall that Vic left school when he was about fifteen and he went to work at the fruitmarket.
4. Vic married his first wife in about 1976, when he was nineteen. I remember that, if we were out at the weekend, Victor would usually go home while we would go to the dancing. He was also up very early in the morning to work at the fruitmarket so he wouldn't be able to stay out drinking.
5. I do not recall Vic's drinking habits changing when he started working in the bar in the early 1990s. He worked long hours. A couple of times I went to the bar when he was working and he wouldn't have been drinking while he was at work.
6. Vic was not the type to drink in the house. I would say that he was more of a social drinker.

7. Although I would see Vic and Jean in the pub sometimes, they enjoyed having meals out and going to the pictures. They spent a lot of time with Jean's sisters' children. Vic was very close to them.

8. It is pure nonsense to say that Vic would drink 50 – 100 units per week. I am aware of how much alcohol that number of units involves. Even when he was drinking across a weekend due to a special occasion such as a wedding, he would not drink that much during that period.
