AFFIDAVIT OF MR CHARLIE CUNNINGHAM

At GLASGOW on the TWENTY THIRD day of JANUARY Two
Thousand and Twelve, in the presence of LYNN FRASER Solicitor and Notary
Public, COMPEARED MR CHARLIE CUNNINGHAM residing at [REDACTED]
[REDACTED] who being solemnly sworn depones as follows:-

1. My date of birth is [REDACTED]. I work in the building trade.
2. I knew the late Victor Tamburrini through school and playing football. We both attended St Leonard's High School in Easterhouse and I also worked with him at the fruit market in Glasgow.
3. The fruit market was my first job after leaving school and Victor was the same. He worked as a porter. I was a wholesaler.
4. Victor worked from 5.30am for eight hours. He worked five days per week and sometimes on a Saturday as overtime. He drove to and from work.
5. After we finished work, we used to go to Ritchie's on Oswald Street. We would ~~bowl or go to the gym, or sit in the canteen talking.~~ Sometimes we would clear out my car and have a blether.
6. I never saw Victor drinking to excess. If we went to a nightclub he would have a couple of drinks but that was all.
7. I would say that Victor was sedate and never really did anything wild. He was always the sensible one. When I did stupid things, I would ask him for advice.

- 8. I don't recall an escalation in Victor's drinking when he started working in the bar. I used to go and visit him when he was working there and never saw him drinking.

- 9. I was very close to Victor and was at the hospital when he died. I don't think he would have been able to drink before his first transplant as he was so ill.

- 10. I know that Victor spent most of his spare time with Jean and they loved eating Italian food. He also spent a lot of time with his nephews and treated them like his sons. He would be driving a lot of the time and his social life didn't really involve drinking.
