Dear John,

Human Intermediate Factor VIII Concentrate

From our previous conversation you will no doubt recall I hope that sufficient supplies of human intermediate factor VIII concentrate would be available in Edinburgh in January 1975 to cover the operative needs of our haemophiliacs and to enable me to start some of them on "on demand" therapy at home. To-date our experiences have not suggested that the amount of material needed for home treatment when it is restricted to an "on demand" basis exceeds that used by the same patients attending the Centre.

There is a less urgent need for the dry product to replace cryoprecipitate where the patient is unable to inject himself and has of necessity to attend the Centre.

I would be glad to know the present state of play in this matter.
