**HTLV III INACTIVATION STUDIES IN BLOOD PRODUCTS**

You will no doubt recall that we had some discussions some time ago regarding a collaborative study to evaluate the efficacy of FVIII heating regimes in inactivating potential HTLV III contamination of products produced at this Centre. At that time you very kindly agreed that such studies were important and that you would be able to contribute to such studies by providing virus and residual infectivity assays. You will also doubtless recall that technical and Health and Safety Executive problems at our end delayed the initiation of such studies. Similar studies were, in the meantime, reported in the literature providing some measure of confidence in our heating protocols. As a consequence, the perceived importance of pursuing our original plans for a collaborative study diminished (I understand that you also moved your laboratory!). I now believe that these perceptions were a little premature since data was presented at the recent AIDS meeting in Washington which casts some doubt on the safety of heated coagulation factor concentrates and equally importantly, intravenous immunoglobulin preparations. The latter is a new development in the debate (I enclose some pre-prints - in confidence) and as the sole manufacturer within the UK of this product our ability to demonstrate its safety is of paramount importance. Bruce Cuthbertson has been vigorously pursuing an evaluation of our manufacturing process for the manufacture of IV IgG assay, using a range of model viruses which suggest that the inclusion of pH 4/mild pepsin treatment of our IgG product quantitatively inactivates virus. This is reassuring but in the current climate we need unequivocal evidence of inactivation of the real things in order to avoid an imminent crisis of confidence!
