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Dear John

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Please find enclosed a rather hastie transcription of my notes of the HCV Symposium early this month.

HCV

Could I just add that in spite of obvious difficulties with the current Ortho Elisa assay (susceptiblility to "stickiness", unrealiability of predicitive value with heat treated samples, etc) I have developed a very strong feeling that the screening of donors for HCV antibodies should be introduced at the earliest possibile opportunity. This is not because of the "science", but because there appears to be little doubt that people have contracted HCV as a result of transfusions which they would not have received had those transfusions been screened for HCV antibody. Furthermore there are apparently five known cases of HCC due to PTH. The reason, therefore, from my proposing this veiw is actually one based on future litigation. I am pretty convinced that the NBTS and SNBTS will find legal action taken against them in about 10 years' time from persons who have sustained post transfusion hepatitis as a result of receiving HCV antibody containing blood which was presumably infectious for HCV at the time.
